## Synopsis

At Gim Hiang Restaurant, a three-generation business, the woks are sizzling, the soup is boiling, and the tempers? Piping hot.

For decades, Lau Dua Gim has been the undisputed king of this three-generation Teochew restaurant, serving up time-honored recipes and ruling with a firm hand, a sharp cleaver, and an even sharper tongue. But times are changing—rents are rising, customers' preferences are evolving, and Dua Gim starts to wonder if Gim Hiang can survive the next chapter.

Enter Zhi Ren, the prodigal youngest son. As a child, he was the golden boy of the kitchen, the one Dua Gim thought would inherit the family legacy. But

instead of staying, Zhi Ren packed his knives and flew off to Paris—pursuing culinary training in Paris. Over the years, he climbed the ranks of a Michelin-starred restaurant, working his way up from apprentice to sous chef.

Now, after years of refining his craft abroad, Zhi Ren returns home for a visit, stepping back into the kitchen where it all began. But home is different now. So is he. As soon as he picks up a knife, old tensions resurface. Dua Gim believes that tradition is what gives Teochew cuisine its soul, while Zhi Ren sees room for evolution. What begins as a simple conversation about flavours soon escalates into a full-blown family debate.

So what's on the menu? A hefty serving of father-son rivalry, a dash of nostalgia, and a generous helping of chaos. Will Gim Hiang stay true to its roots, or is it time to spice things up? In this hilarious and heartwarming family feud, one thing is certain—things are about to get messy in the kitchen!

NYT sees Chinese culture as the foundation of its work but not the centre of its practice. We believe in the uniqueness of local Chinese culture and aspires to recognise and celebrate the multicultural identity of the Singaporean Chinese through theatre.

NYT tells stories through live performances that remind us of our humanity. Since our inception, NYT has been invested in the training of actors, in order to create work that is consistent in quality. We strive to entertain audiences in ways that are honest and thoughtful. Our work is recognised for being

accessible and culturally layered, possessing deep sensibilities that speak to audiences from all backgrounds. Fluid in scale and genre, NYT creates performances ranging from original plays and transcreations, to interdisciplinary and international collaborations.

In recognition of our contributions to the promotion, enrichment and development of Singaporean Chinese culture, NYT was awarded the Singapore Chinese Cultural Contribution Award (Organisation) presented by the Singapore Chinese Cultural Centre in 2024.

### **Creators'** Message

#### **Generation Is Culture**

To the young, the older generation may seem conservative and stubborn; to the older generation, the young appear disconnected from the past and are all about pursuing novelty. These stereotypes — these intergenerational conflicts — are tales that have been told time and again. Yet the personal struggles within them are far more complex. Each era that retells this story brings with it a meaning unique to its time.

In today's rapidly changing world, each generation grows up in vastly different environments. The technology they encounter, the methods they use, the ways they relate to others, and the values they uphold — all of these differ significantly. As such, each generation forms its own culture. Engaging with another generation requires the same patience and openness as encountering a different region, ethnic group, or language.

*Home Kitchen* is precisely about this. "Heritage is respecting the past and envisioning the future. Respect requires humility; envisioning demands courage. Thus, heritage is a collaboration between generations."

Singapore may be a young nation, but its rivers of traditional culture run deep and wide. With limited space comes a high density of cultural integration, making any loss of tradition all the more palpable — be it mother tongue cultures, Chinese dialects, heritage brands, or even the local Mandarin theatre.

Of course, this does not mean that history and tradition are burdens. In telling this story, we hope to move people — to help them experience the human relationships at the heart of heritage. After all, history and tradition are shaped by time and events, but the future of heritage — its very momentum — lies in people.

Lastly, we extend our heartfelt gratitude to the Singapore Chinese Cultural Centre for inviting NYT to present this original local production as part of Cultural Extravaganza 25. We are also deeply thankful for the "Singapore Chinese Cultural Contribution Award (Organisation)" presented to us last year, which affirms our continued efforts in progressing Singapore's Mandarin theatre.

### **NELSON CHIA**

**Playwright and Director** 

**Artistic Director and Co-Founder of Nine Years Theatre** 

Nelson Chia is a director, performer, playwright, acting teacher and theatre lecturer. He has won Best Director four times and Best Actor twice at the Straits Times Life! Theatre Awards. In 2012, Nelson was the first Singapore artist to be commissioned for three consecutive years by Esplanade – Theatres on the Bay to present a major theatre work at the annual Huayi – Chinese Festival of Arts.

In 2017, he transcreated Cultural Medallion writer Yeng Pway Ngon's seminal novel *Art Studio* for the stage, which was commissioned by Singapore International Festival of Arts (SIFA) as the opening programme for the festival that year. In 2021, he collaborated with the renowned SITI Company from New York to present a hybrid version of Chekhov's *Three Sisters* at SIFA 2020/21. Other commissioning and artistic partners he has worked with include Macau Arts Festival, Singapore Chinese Cultural Centre, M1 Singapore Fringe Festival, Singapore Writers' Festival, The Substation, The Arts House, World Shakespeare Congress, T.H.E. Dance Company and Contemporary Legend Theatre (Taiwan), to name a few.

Nelson's directorial works are marked by detailed and dynamic ensemble work. His original scripts and transcreations are known to be culturally layered, possessing sensibilities that speak to audiences from all backgrounds. In 2012, Nelson, with his wife Mia Chee, co-founded Nine Years Theatre (NYT) – currently the only company under NAC's "Major Company Scheme" that positions itself as a Singapore Mandarin theatre company. NYT sees Chinese culture as the foundation of its work but not the centre of its practice. It believes in the uniqueness of local Chinese culture and aspires to recognise and celebrate the multicultural identity of the Singaporean Chinese through theatre.



### MIA CHEE

**Producer and Choreographer for Yam Paste Sequence & Interlude Company Director and Co-Founder of Nine Years Theatre** 

Mia Chee is an actor, theatre producer, and educator, and the Co-founder and Company Director of Nine Years Theatre (NYT). Her performance journey began at the age of nine when she joined Rediffusion's children and youth radio drama group, where she was first trained to perform in Mandarin. She continued performing throughout her school years and later graduated in Theatre Studies and Chinese Language from the National University of Singapore.

In 2012, Mia co-founded Nine Years Theatre with Nelson Chia, with the shared vision of building a professional Mandarin theatre company in Singapore — one rooted in rigorous actor training, ensemble practice, and a creative philosophy that is culturally layered, globally minded, and reflective of Singapore's multicultural identity.

To deepen her understanding of the actor's craft, Mia studied the Viewpoints approach with the SITI Company (New York) and the Suzuki Method of Actor Training with both the SITI Company and the Suzuki Company of Toga (Japan). She has practised both methods for over a decade, and regularly leads NYT's actor training programmes, including ensemble jams, classes, and educational workshops on these methodologies. She's currently an Alumni Network Ambassador of the SITI Company.

Mia also worked as a part-time DJ at Y.E.S. FM93.3 from 1997 to 2014, an extension of her early background in radio performance. Since 2015, she has taught NYT's Mandarin Enunciation classes (formerly *Diction of Standard Mandarin*), and in 2024 began teaching *Mandarin Speech Work for Performance*, continuing her dedication to voice and speech training for actors. From 2014 to 2021, she was a founding and core member of the NYT Ensemble, where she led vocal and speech work.

As a performer, Mia has collaborated with many of Singapore's leading theatre companies, including Toy Factory Productions, Drama Box, The Theatre Practice, The Necessary Stage, and TheatreWorks (now T:>Works). Her notable performance credits include *Waiting For Audience, Everything For You, See You, Anniversary, Windward Side of the Mountain, Between You and Me, Three Sisters, Dear Elena, First Fleet, FAUST/US, Cut Kafka!, Art Studio, Red Demon, Tartuffe, An Enemy of the People, and Who's Afraid of Virginia Woolf?.*

## **REI POH as Lau Dua Gim**

Rei is an actor and theatre practitioner whose work spans acting, directing, and participatory performance. As a performer, he has appeared in *Dream Under the Southern Borough* (2020, Toy Factory/SIFA) and multiple runs of *Grandmother Tongue* (2016, 2018, 2020, Wild Rice), earning a nomination for Best Supporting Actor at the 2016 Straits Times Life! Theatre Awards. Rei was a founding member of the Nine Years Theatre Ensemble and performed in acclaimed productions such as *Enemy of the People* and *Twelve Angry* 

*Men*, the latter earning a Best Ensemble award in 2013.



## JOEL TAN as Lau Zhi Ren

Joel Tan is a Singaporean actor. Since graduating, he has worked as a professional actor in theatre and film, hosting and voiceover work. He is currently invested in telling Singaporean stories and expanding the local repertoire. He also strongly advocates for local languages, mainly showcasing the multilingualism unique to Singapore on our main stage. He speaks Singlish, English, Mandarin, Hokkien, Cantonese, and basic Japanese.

Joel is also a performing arts educator specialising in actor training and voice and speech coaching. He has coached students from primary school to adulthood. His pedagogical approach focuses on demystifying 'talent' into actionable,

step-by-step exercises to develop a student's craft. This can involve acting exercises and speech science to bolster understanding. As an educator, he works towards enhancing the quality of performing arts education in Singapore. He will pursue his Master of Fine Arts in Theatre Voice Pedagogy with the University of Alberta this coming September. Before leaving, Joel will be performing in a musical, *Moonlit City*, by Toy Factory.

## AUDREY LUO as Leung Yoon Yoon

Audrey is a versatile bilingual stage and screen actress, singer, host, and voice-over artist with an extensive career spanning theatre, film, and television. She has collaborated with renowned companies such as Drama Box, ECNAD, The Finger Players, The Necessary Stage, Pangdemonium, TheatreWorks (now T:>Works), The Theatre Practice, Toy Factory, W!LD RICE, and Checkpoint Theatre. Audrey's international credits include tours to Japan, Hong Kong, Taipei, Shanghai, and New York.

In 2012, Audrey won the Best Supporting Actress award at the 12th The Straits Times Life! Theatre Awards for her

performance in *881 The Musical*. Other notable roles include the titular character in Toy Factory's *Titoudao* (2015) and 'Mrs Wong' in the feature film *Our Sister Mambo*.

Audrey co-produced and performed in her first Mandarin monologue, *My Mother's Chest*, to full houses in 2016. She was nominated for Best Actress at The Straits Times Life! Theatre Awards in 2020 and 2022.

Audrey recently co-produced, wrote, and performed in her second one-woman show, *FORTYtude*. She also hosted the 2025 Chingay Parade – *Joy. Home Kitchen* marks her debut with Nine Years Theatre, and she is excited to collaborate with the talented team.

Jodi graduated from the University of Exeter, UK, with a Master of Arts degree in Theatre Practice - Physical Performance & Actor Training (Distinction). Since 2014, she has been working professionally as a theatre performer and educator. ## **REGINA TOON as Lau Qian Lian**

Regina is an actor, singer-songwriter and filmmaker who also creates and performs under the artist name Ora 晰月.

She trained in East 15 Acting School (UK), Intercultural Theatre Institute (Singapore) and has travelled extensively around the world, researching and experiencing various traditional and contemporary performance systems.

She has performed both locally and internationally. Her most recent prominent role was that of Achilles in *The Wreath Of Achilles*, an original poetic drama staged in China as part of the Wuhan Literature Season in late 2023.

In her music endeavours, she was awarded the Most Promising Youth Award by \*SCAPE at SingVoice 2021, a

competition for Mandopop singer-songwriters after releasing her first music single 《戏场》. In the field of filmmaking, she has written, directed and produced *《Heart Shape* 莲蓉包》(2021) and *Sunny* (2023) with Viddsee Studios.

As an artist of multiple disciplines, she believes that it is not about what modality she uses, but what story she tells. She hopes to tell stories which can take audience on colourful journeys into diverse worlds, and bring about discovery, healing and inspiration within them.

Xuan was trained at LASALLE College of the Arts, where she got her BA (Hons) in Acting. She acts across mediums, genres, and languages.

Established in 1969, Song Fa Bak Kut Teh is a Singaporean restaurant chain that sells Teochew-style pork rib soup or bak kut teh. Its mission is to preserve the dining experience of this heritage dish, and it aspires to cultivate generations of people who will enjoy it.

Song Fa was founded by Yeo Eng Song, who started selling bak kut teh at a stall along Johor Road made from his own recipe. He later moved to a coffeeshop on Victoria Street in 1975 and eventually, to the iconic outlet at New Bridge Road in 2007. Since then, the business has grown from one to 14 outlets\* in Singapore. While the formula to create the dish is constantly being fine-tuned and improved, the flavour will always remain authentic.

Currently managed by Mr. Yeo's three children Diana Yeo, Yeo Hart Pong and Yeo Zhi Yong, Song Fa serves up piping hot bowls of peppery pork rib soup, brewed from quality ingredients sourced from around the region. Each is best washed down with a pot of Kung Fu tea, supplied to the company by heritage tea merchant Pek Sin Choon. In doing so, it hopes to cultivate tea drinking among the younger generations.

Found in every Song Fa outlet is a pushcart, a replica of the original Mr. Yeo used when he first started selling bak kut teh, and a nod to the roots of the company. Friendly staff trained to uphold the service-oriented culture of the brand greet diners warmly and remain attentive to every need.

In 2014, Song Fa started expanding overseas first into Jakarta, Indonesia. Since then, it has opened multiple outlets in the country, as well in others city like Shanghai, Bangkok and Taipei. More plans are in the pipeline to enter other markets in Southeast Asia and Asia.

Favoured by old and young, locals and tourists, the company received its biggest endorsement in 2016 when it was awarded the Michelin Bib Gourmand. It has since held on to this accolade for eight years. Song Fa is also highly rated on multiple platforms such as Meituan-Dianping, Ctrip, TripAdvisor and Lonely Planet.
